Helped in successfully lobbying for a new jail pod that opened in 2007. Initiated and helped secure two large law enforcement contracts to local cities. Planned and implemented a re-organization within the office in 2007. Working on a Metropolitan Model of policing for consideration this November's ballot; the opening of another satellite jail complex in 2009; and converting our dispatch center to a primary answering point for redundancy issues in the valley.
